WATER HARVESTING SYSTEMS REBATE PROGRAM

PURPOSE:

To provide monetary relief to Developers and Homeowners who install water harvesting systems as a primary means for landscape irrigation thereby conserving municipal potable water.

PROVISIONS:

Water Harvesting Systems that meet and conform to the City of Prescott's building and plumbing codes and are approved by the city's Building Department qualify for installation rebates.

Water Harvesting Systems must be of a capacity not less than 1000 gallons.

Installation of Water Harvesting Systems may be installed by an Arizona licensed contractor, or an individual homeowner. In either case, the system must conform to the city's building and plumbing codes, and will require a final inspection by the city's Building Inspector.

Developers and Homeowners will be required to submit a formal request for monetary rebates after securing a final approval from the city's Building Inspector. Rebate Forms will be available at the city's Building Department or Utilities Department.

Sources of funding for Water Harvesting System rebates are :

IMPACT FEES:

1. Planned Area Development (PAD projects where the developer offers single or multi-family units (3 or less), and not undeveloped lots. Includes common areas
2. New individual single or multi-family unit (3 or less)
3. New Commercial Development

WATER CONSERVATION BUDGET:

1. Installation of Water Harvesting Systems for existing single and multi-family units (3 or less)
2. Installation of Water Harvesting Systems for existing Commercial Properties.

REBATE COMPUTATION:

SYSTEM CAPACITY (Gallons)	REBATE % OF INSTALL COST
1000 – 2000	50%
2000 – 5000	40%
5000 +	25%

Note: 1. Maximum rebate regardless of capacity is \$3000.00
