**Zone 24 and 27 Water Utility Improvement Project**

PBS&J was awarded the engineering and design service contract for replacement of the Zone 27 pump station in the vicinity of Thumb Butte Road and West Gurley Street, the design for a new 12 inch ductile water main from the replacement pump station west along Thumb Butte Road to the intersection of Sherwood Drive; the design for a replacement Zone 24 water reservoir and siting and property acquisition for the new Zone 27 reservoir B.

The new Zone 27 reservoir will replace the existing reservoir and be at a similar elevation to the existing Zone 27 reservoir. The need for these projects is to correct deficiencies identified in the water system model that was completed in 2005. These projects will enhance pressure Zone 24 and Zone 27 water delivery, storage capacity, and providing a better water system for residents. The replacement Zone 24 water reservoir has been completed and construction is anticipated to start in Fall of 2010. The Zone 27 pump station and water main design should be complete by Winter of 2010 with construction anticipated in the Fall of 2011. Property acquisition has been completed for the new Zone 27 reservoir B, and the City is currently negotiating a contract for the design project with PBS&J. The design project is anticipated to be complete by Summer 2011.

City staff completed our first public meeting on April 7, 2009 at the Yavapai Community College Library and most of the meeting questions were regarding the future location of the new Zone 27 reservoir B. On February 11, 2010 City staff and the project consultant completed our second public meeting to disclose the proposed locations for the Zone 27 pump station, reservoir and to review the property acquisition analysis matrix. The meeting also included a more detailed design for the Zone 24 reservoir and the need to transfer or acquire open space land for the tank project. See attached meeting summary and comments.
