Walks are graded on a scale of 1-4 (with 4 being the most difficult)

HIKING BOOTS RECOMENDED - CARRY WATER - DOGS MUST BE ON LEASH

Sunday, February 1 (**BONUS HIKE – Full Moon –5:00PM Start Time**)

“Lynx Lake West Side” – Paved side of the lake, out and back.

Level: 2

Directions: Turn on Walker Road towards Lynx Lake. Turn left at the road to the Marina Store. Park in **USES FEE AREA** beyond store. To carpool, meet on the east side of PetSmart parking lot. (1+ hour)

Tuesday, February 3

“Horse Camp #383” – Pretty Views. Dirt trail through timber below horse camp. A nice loop hike dropping down into Groom Creek and then looping back up to the parking area. This can be a rather dusty trail because of the heavy use by horses.

Level: 2.5 - 3

Directions: Turn south on Senator Highway and go approximately 6.5 miles to Groom Creek Horse Camp. Park at the #307 trailhead on the left. (1 hour)

Thursday, February 5

“Centennial Trail West”– This new trail starts at the Dalke petroglyphs area and descends towards Forbing Park and N. Kile St. Recently extended to Westridge and is now a 4-mile hike.

Level: 2.5

Directions: Take Gail Gardner Way towards the old Lamb Subaru dealership and turn west on to Westridge Dr. Go towards Downer Trail and make a left. Right on Sierry Peaks Dr and then a right on Ridgewood Dr. Meet on the corner of Ridgewood Dr. and Enchanted Canyon Way. For carpool options, meet at Prescott True Value. (2 hours)

Tuesday, February 10

“Longs Canyon Loop #316 and #317” - Approximate 3-mile loop. The hike will begin from the Thumb Butte Parking area on trail 316. We will hike 316 to 317 and do a loop on trail #317. Return to the parking area on #316.

Level: 2-3

Directions: Go west on Gurley Street (turns into Thumb Butte Road) until you enter Thumb Butte Park. Parking on the right. **USFS FEE AREA**. To carpool, meet at the bowling alley. (1 hour)

“Granite Basin – Trail #349, 350 & 351” - Dirt trail that is fairly level but with some inclines. Out and back trail with lots of trees and views.

Level: 2.5

Directions: Take Iron Springs Road West and turn right into Granite Basin Road. Turn right at Cayuse Equestrian Day Use Area and park there. **USFS FEE AREA**. To carpool, meet at intersection of Iron Springs and Granite Basin Road. (2 hours)

“Watson Lake” – Trail goes from the boat dock at the South end of the park, along the lake, and then into the Watson Wood Riparian area.

Level: 1

Directions: Go into Watson Lake Park. After the pay station turn right and go down to the boat dock. **C.O.P Fee Area** (1 hour)

“Peavine/Lakeshore Trail”– A nice flat hike on the Peavine Trail to the Lakeshore Trail. Then follow the Lakeshore trail until it ties back into the Peavine and back to the trailhead. The Lakeshore Trail goes through and over rocks in the area west of the Peavine Trail.

Level: 3

Directions: From Highway 89, turn east on Prescott Parkway, then north on Sundog Ranch Road. Turn left into a marked parking area for the Peavine Trail just before the transfer station. **C.O.P Fee Area** (2 hours).

Saturday, February 21 (BONUS HIKE-10:00AM Start Time)

“Quartz Mountain Trail 9415” – Fairly steep dirt trail to the top of beautiful quartz rock with panoramic views.

Level: 4

Directions: Go out White Spar Road about 2 miles past Safeway. Turn left into White Spar campground and immediately park on the right.

Tuesday, February 24

“Hobbit Trail” – Trail starts by old Hwy 89A past the Pinion Pines & 3 Sisters Consignment near the bridge. The trail starts out in a Riparian area with a steep downhill descent to a wooded area in grasslands with scenic views of the Dells & Glassford.

Level: 1.5

Directions: Take Hwy 89 past 2701 E Old Us Highway 89A, “old Pinion Pines” by 3 Sisters Consignment and park along the roadside by 89a bridge. (1 hour)

Thursday, February 26

“Butte Creek/FS 321 Trail”– Trail winds by the side of the new Hassayampa golf course and development area and Forest Service trails. Rolling trail offers nice views of golf course. The hike continues on FS trail 321 and a possible visit to “The Cowboy Prayer” rock.

Level: 3

Directions: Go west on Gurley Street to Sherwood Drive, one block past the entrance to Hassayampa Village. Turn left on Sherwood and follow it until you see Stricklin Park on your left. Park along road and walk across the creek to the trailhead. (2 hours)
