



**TREKABOUT HIKING CLUB -April 2026**

**Tuesday hikes 8:00am – 9:00am - Thursday hikes 8:00am – 10:00am**

**Walks are graded on a scale of 1-4 (with 4 being the most difficult)**

***HIKING BOOTS RECOMENDED - CARRY WATER - DOGS MUST BE ON LEASH***

**Thursday, April 2**

**“Parker Canyon Trail #738, 742, 738, 743, 324”**– Mostly shaded forest hike through oak and ponderosa pines, following scenic Miller Creek. About 4+ miles with fresh air, wooded views, and connecting sections (Trail 324) that loop back toward the Painted Rock parking area.

Level: 3

**Directions:** Take Thumb Butte Rd about to White Rock parking area. (2 hours)

**Tuesday, April 7**

**“Feldmeier Trail”** " – Newer trail near Goldwater Lake that follows parallel with Senator Hwy intersecting Banning Creek Trail #330. This is a beautiful hike through an open Ponderosa Pine forest. This is an out and back hike.

Level: 2

**Directions:** From Gurley Street, take Mt. Vernon Street (turns into Senator Highway). The trailhead is on the left about ½ mile past the entrance to Goldwater Lake. This is the same parking area that is used for trails 62 and 299. (1 hour)

**Thursday, April 9**

**“Hobbit Trail”** - The hike begins on the Hobbit Trail off Old Hwy 89A near the bridge by Pinion Pines and 3 Sisters Consignment, starting in a riparian area before descending steeply into a wooded section surrounded by open grasslands with scenic views of the Dells and Glassford Hill. Connects with Gateway, Boblett, Trampas, Silverback and Soggy Bottom Trails.

Level: 1.5

**Directions:**

Take Hwy 89 past 2701 E Old US Highway 89A (old Pinion Pines) near 3 Sisters Consignment. Park along the roadside near the Hwy 89A bridge where the trail begins. (2 hours)

**Tuesday, April 14**

**“Willow Peninsula Trails”** - Take a hike around the lake, through the Cottonwood Peninsula and old shooting club ruins. Turn around after a half-hour

Level: 1.5

**Directions:** Meet behind Willow Creek Park Dog Park at trailhead past ball field. Dog Park is located off Willow Creek Rd, across from the auto dealerships. (1 hour)

**Thursday, April 16**

**“318 West, 316 Miller Creek”**- Beautiful forest trail parallel to the Miller Creek. Fresh air and refreshing, wooded scenery. Trails 318, 316, and 318 which loops back to the White Rock parking area.

Level: 3

**Directions:** Thumb Butte Road to White Rock parking lot (2 hours)

**Tuesday, April 21**

**“Greenways”** – Two mile out and back trail along granite creek to mile high middle school, with lots of foliage and deciduous trees. This is an urban hike through the city.

Level: 1

**Directions:** Park in the Sprouts Shopping Center near Staples. Path to park is located on sidewalk next to Staples. (1 hour)

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**Thursday, April 23**

**“East Bay Loops”**– This trail explores the Dells on the east shore of Willow Lake. Much of this trail is on flat ground on the East end of Willow Lake. As you get closer to the dam the hike enters the granite formation of the dells and becomes more technical with some climbing on granite boulders.

Level: 3

**Directions:** Park in dirt pullout on Willow Lake Rd., west of Prescott Lakes Parkway across the road from Britni Rd. (2 hours)

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**Tuesday, April 28**

**“Peavine/Lakeshore Trail”**– A nice flat hike on the Peavine Trail to the Lakeshore Trail. Then follow the Lakeshore trail until it ties back into the Peavine and back to the trailhead. The Lakeshore Trail goes through and over rocks in the area west of the Peavine Trail.

Level: 3

**Directions:** From Highway 89, turn east on Prescott Parkway, then north on Sundog Ranch Road. Turn left into a marked parking area just before the transfer station. **C.O.P Fee Area** (1 hour)

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**Thursday, April 30**

**“Almosta Trail” #622-** This is a county trail that starts at the Almosta Trailhead and then becomes Trail #622 once it enters Prescott National Forest. This is a pleasant hike over ridgetops and through riparian areas. The trail can be narrow in spots and there are a couple of short, steep climbs.

Level: 3

**Directions:** From its intersection with Iron Springs Road, travel north on Williamson Valley Road for 12.5 miles to Almosta Ranch Road. Turn left on Almosta Ranch Road and proceed 0.7 miles to the trailhead on the left. Parking is good. (2 hours)
