

FY27 Pavement Preservation Project

The City of Prescott and their contractor, Cactus Asphalt, are set to begin the FY27 Pavement Preservation Project the week of August 17, 2026. The project includes pavement maintenance operations, as well as select concrete curb, gutter and sidewalk improvements along the following roadways throughout Prescott:

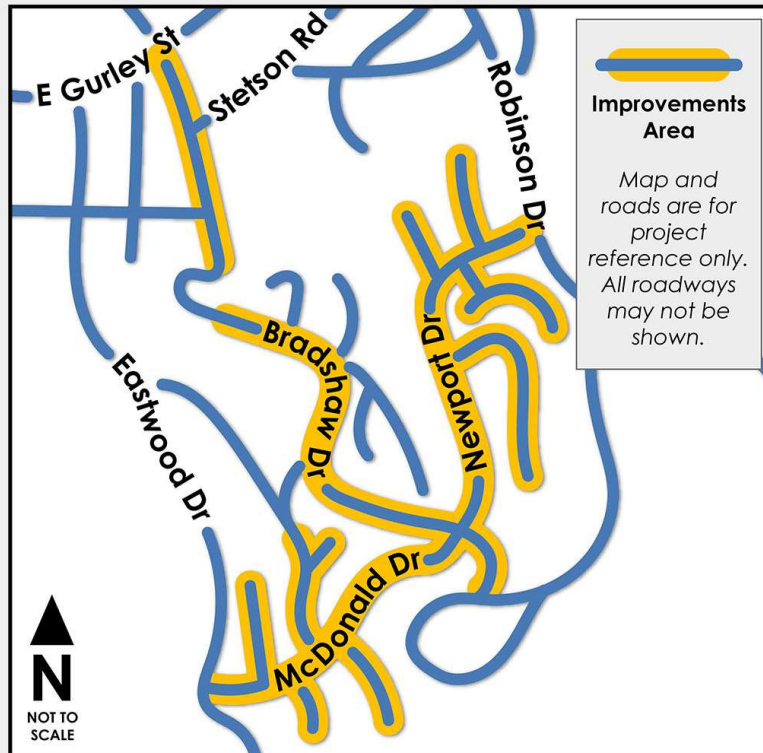
- Bradshaw Drive
- Newport Drive
- Newport Ridge Drive
- Jordin Drive
- Oxford Drive
- Rhonda Drive
- Sheffield Drive
- McDonald Drive
- Quail Hollow Drive
- Broadview Drive
- Pauley Drive
- McDonald Court
- Sycamore Canyon

Concrete improvements will be completed prior to pavement maintenance occurring along each roadway. The City is dedicated to keeping the traveling public, businesses and residents informed of potential construction impacts throughout the project.

- Continuous residential access
- Temporary lane and driveway restrictions
- Reduced speeds
- Rough road conditions
- Loud noise
- Flagging operations

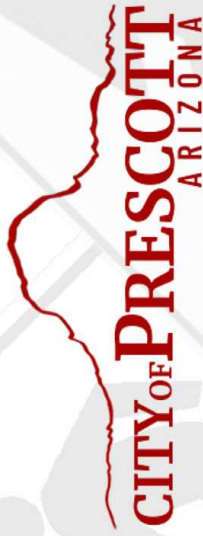

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Scheduled to begin the week of August 17, 2026

A detailed door hanger notification will be hand delivered to those directly affected prior to work commencing on each roadway. The notifications include information regarding the specific pavement treatment the roadway will receive, and the associated access, work hours and impacts.



To avoid conflicts with construction equipment and expedite completion of the project, the City asks that you avoid on-street parking while construction is underway. Access to businesses and residences will be maintained when possible, however, temporary restrictions will occur when asphalt paving and concrete installation operations are taking place.
